WANT MORE FUNDING? USE YOUR VOICE!

On Friday 27th September we hope to have 5,000 Headteachers marching in London demanding - politely - fairer funding for schools. Please will you be one of them?

We have the backing of an MP from each of the major parties and Caroline Lucas (Green) is marching with us too.

A lot of work on this has been undertaken by the teaching unions and a group called f40 who campaign for fairer funding in education for those LAs who receive the lowest per capita allocation. This has resulted in a clear message to government about the amount of extra funding needed to reverse the 'real' cuts in the last years.

We need £12.6 billion by 2022/23. This $\underline{\text{document}}$ explains it clearly.
