Worth-Less? Campaign

As many of you know the politely relentless campaign to secure improved funding for schools goes on. Last year 2,000 Heads in the politest and best behaved protest London



has seen went from Parliament Square to No.10 to present a petition calling on the government to increase funding to schools so that schools might ensure that all children get the education they need and deserve.

In the year since then there have been improvements including part funding of the salary increases and a contribution to the pension contributions - but despite a meeting with Damien Hinds, Secretary of State for Education, there is still far, far more needed for schools simply to deliver as they are now. So on Friday 27 September, Jules White is calling on Headteachers to march again. He would like 5,000 Headteachers to be there this time.

If you are a governor I hope that you will support your Headteacher in this - you know the challenges that increasing austerity causes to your schools and see it every meeting in the budgets. And if your Headteacher really cannot go — could you march instead?

I am well aware that a day out of school is not only difficult to manage but often means hours of catch-up afterwards but I would
