Sharon Waldron, Headteacher at Stonham Aspal CEVAP School provides an update on the 'WorthLess?' campaign:

WorthLess? has gained a unique insight into the state of England's schools and academies since the introduction of the new National Funding Formula (NFF). WorthLess? represent over 60 Local Authorities and Boroughs with a reach to several million families.

Current Concerns

- Since 2010 school budgets have been reduced in real terms by 8% and by 20% at post-16
- Class sizes are rising and the curricular offer is being restricted
- Increasingly, schools are being asked to support with children's emotional health and wellbeing. Frequently, we do not have adequate resource to meet a growing need.
- Often, the most vulnerable students in our schools those from disadvantaged backgrounds or those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) – are bearing the brunt of cuts and schools are struggling to provide the levels of support that they are entitled to.

Latest Actions have included:

- Surveys to gather an accurate picture from serving head teachers across the country
- Writing to MP's including a cabinet debate on 4 March
- Writing to parents and carers on 8 March raising these issues nationally
- TV and radio broadcasts both national and local (Stonham Aspal CEVAP School included in Look East broadcast on 8 March and Sharon was on Radio Suffolk again on 8 March).

We need to be politely relentless with our support of this campaign.

For years now Suffolk has been in the bottom third for funding and although the fairer funding formula is slowly improving our situation, as the pot of funding has not truly been increased (as the pupil numbers have gone up the funding has gone up), we are likely to continue to fall into the lower funded authorities category. It is our children who suffer. What more could we achieve with our children? What more could we offer if we were funded appropriately?
