News from the Diocese

Dear colleagues,

The return to school this September has been like no other. I am full of admiration for Headteachers and staff who have worked so hard to ensure a safe and welcoming return. Pupils are pleased to be back in school and the importance of education has never been greater. I am very aware of the ongoing pressures on schools and we continue to offer support and provide opportunities for Headteachers and governors to come together.

It was good to read in the TES of the Archbishop of Canterbury's concerns for school funding and for disadvantaged pupils - please click here. Please know that you are part of a much bigger family of Church of England schools across the country.

Within the diocese, the Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) has recently approved a number of new resources which we hope will be helpful to you. Gemma Kingston's excellent resources on collective worship have been proving very useful, I know. These went out directly to Headteachers, RE subject leaders and to clergy in September and can be found here. Gemma has also written a really helpful guide to developing a Christian vision for your school, which can be found here. I am indebted to the Diocese of Coventry which has written a very helpful guide on responding to racism in schools which it has kindly allowed us to use in our diocese and can be found here. We have been thinking for some time about how best to support schools in discussing this issue and I am delighted to commend this resource to you.

Our training programme is on our website (further details opposite) and I would encourage you to have a look and book on any courses which interest you. May I especially commend our conference on 18 November, to which you are warmly invited? Bishop Mike will be speaking and Jon Neal, CEO of Suffolk Mind will speak about wellbeing. We are running courses by Zoom this term, which does have the benefit of saving time and travel, although we miss seeing you face to face. We are very happy to visit you in schools if you would like us to, but will at all times respect your wishes and are equally happy to meet via Zoom as you prefer.

Please ensure that governors determine the policy at a FGB/LGB meeting and that this is clearly minuted.


