Bishops' Call to Prayer and Generosity

Bishop Martin and Bishop Mike have written to every benefice calling for a time of prayer and generosity. The Bishops are asking everyone to join them in praying the words of the prayer (above) at every service, physical or online, until All Saints Day on Sunday 1 November.

The Bishops are calling on parishes and individuals to consider the pressing financial needs of the Church at this time.

Speaking in his Presidential Address at Diocesan Synod on Saturday 3 October, Bishop Martin acknowledged that the coronavirus pandemic had hit hard, at every level:

"This has been a time of global convulsion. As others have said, we are facing not one but three pandemics: the coronavirus, environmental destruction, and racism. This is a time of upheaval, and however much we may look back longingly wanting things to return to how they were, the world is never going to be the same again, and nor will we.

"Churches dependent on plate income have not all recovered what they did not receive for several months; halls have been closed so rental is lost; and there have been no summer fetes and other fundraising events, although I have picked up some wonderfully creative ways parishes are raising funds."



Bishop Martin expressed his passionate belief in the work of the church throughout Suffolk and how it is more needed now, spiritually and practically, than ever, challenging all churches and their congregations to respond.

World Mental Health Day

Saturday 10 October

In the same way that we would rest or seek help with physical health problems, we all feel low at times and need support when our mental wellbeing suffers. Poor mental health and low mood impacts everyone - your friends, your relatives and you. It does not discriminate.

Public Health at Suffolk County Council is supporting different groups of people by providing tailored mental health programmes. The courses enable you to learn how you can help raise awareness and reduce stigma about suicide as part of our Suffolk Life Saver campaign. Each year, around 60 people in Suffolk take their own lives. To tackle this, our aim is to get more people discussing the subject of suicide, challenging myths and pointing to support available. Choral Evensong Cathedral Sunday 11 October, 3.30pm

Choral Evensong will be open to worshippers again at St Edmundsbury Cathedral, for the first time since March. Anyone wishing to attend must pre-book a place by emailing <u>Cathedralinvitations@stedscathedral.org</u> by Saturday lunchtime.

Evensong is drawn almost entirely from the Bible. Its primary purpose is to proclaim the wonderful works of God in history and in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Its secondary purpose is to evoke from the worshipper a response of praise, penitence, prayer, and obedience. Much of the English of the service is the language spoken and written by our ancestors more than four hundred years ago. It may sound old-fashioned but its meaning is not out of date.

IICSA report The Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse, **IICSA**, published its overarching investigation report into the Church of England on Tuesday 6 October. Churches are encouraged to read this open letter from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, the lead safeguarding bishop and the national director of

safeguarding.

Safeguarding Leadership training The new Zoom courses are now listed on Eventbrite here. Each course is limited to 12 participants, and with considerable demand for places, the national team will be offering places to Clergy in the first instance. It is recognised that you may be required to complete Safeguarding Leadership training in order to continue with your duties within the Church. Currently you are able to continue to work without the training. However, Clergy need to book a place as soon as possible and all other posts will be expected to attend a training event as soon as they become available for your role.

Diocesan Board of Patronage There are two lay representative vacancies on the Diocesan Board of Patronage (DBP).

The DBP is patron to 30 benefices, acting either in a sole capacity or jointly with other patrons and is involved (on average) in three or four appointments a year. The Board normally meets annually, receiving quarterly updates from the Chair and direct contact where individuals are acting for a vacancy. Outside these meetings, individual members act as the Board's representative, attending 'Section 12' meetings in vacant benefices and subsequent clergy interviews, so (in normal times) travelling and attendance at evening meetings will be occasionally required (travelling expenses can be reimbursed).
