Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Independent Faith Engagement Review – call for evidence

The government has recently launched an independent faith engagement review, and I want to encourage everyone to participate in the call for evidence. Recommendations from this review will shape the future of how the government engages with faith groups during the COVID-19 recovery phase and beyond. It is vitally important that the government hears what the church has been doing in this time. The survey is very straightforward and takes approximately 20 minutes, depending on how much you wish to comment on your answers.

The experience of COVID-19 has brought into sharp focus the vital work churches do day in day out, often unnoticed, to support the most vulnerable in society. It is often the case that churches support the people who fall between the gaps of different statutory services. This is an opportunity for policymakers and politicians to understand who we are and the contribution we make to building a stronger, more caring society. If we do not take this opportunity, our voice will not be heard at this critical time.

The diocese is already in a strong position not least due to Sandie making progress in our eco church awards. Mark will bring energy and creativity to the role and we look forward to working with him in the environment group and more widely.

In addition, the Revd Richard Stainer has kindly volunteered to undertake some scoping work, particularly on how we move to a net zero carbon emissions diocese by 2030, following the General Synod setting of this ambitious target for the Church of England. Richard will be undertaking this work through to May 2021, working closely with the environment group and others.

Ride and Stride the annual fundraising event for Suffolk's church buildings went ahead in September and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust are pleased to announce that the total far exceeds last year's achievement. So far, with more money still coming in, sponsorship has raised £150,000, exceeding last year's total of £128,223. Pedal & Drive also raised an additional £15,000. Thank you to everyone who took part. In 2021 Suffolk Churches Ride and Stride, and Pedal & Drive, will be held on Saturday 11 September.

Email scams - It appears internet scammers are targeting parish church officers in a rather sophisticated way by using information from parish websites to make the content appear very realistic. This particular scam references Amazon gift vouchers but there could be others. If you think you have a scam email, do not click on any links in the scam email, do not reply to the email or contact the senders in any way, if you have clicked on a link in the email, do not supply any information on the website that may open and finally do not open any attachments that arrive with the email. If you think you may have compromised the safety of your bank details and/or have lost money due to fraudulent misuse of your cards, you should immediately contact your bank.
