Elections

There are many ways in which you can support the mission and ministry of the church across our parishes and one of them is to help us to exercise sound governance. We are encouraging a wide and diverse cross section of our members to become involved. If you feel called to work collaboratively, assisting in openness of communication and ensuring clarity of decision making, then please do come forward to offer your time and talents. Current elections include:

Bishop's Council - Following the summer elections, there remains one clergy-elected vacancy and five laity-elected vacancies. Therefore, a second election is being run and nominations will be welcome from Thursday 21 October, closing on 18 November. If you would like to know about what the Bishop's Council does and the skills and experience it is looking for, click here.

Vacancy in See (VIS) - This committee considers the appointment of a new Diocesan Bishop and only meets when a vacancy occurs. The current membership will end on 31 December 2021 and therefore elections need to be held this autumn. There are two clergy-elected posts and four lay-elected posts. Nominations will be welcome from Thursday 21 October, closing on 18 November. Full details are available here.

The Diocesan Board of Patronage Is patron to a number of benefices within the diocese acting either solely or jointly with others. There are currently two laity vacancies on the Board. Elections will be held in the new year. Further details will be issued in due course.

Diocesan Synod - There are numerous vacancies on Diocesan Synod, both clergy and lay. The membership for this triennium runs from 1 August 2021 to 31 July 2024. Elections take place at deanery synods. If you are interested in representing your deanery at diocesan synod, please speak to your Rural Dean.
