

Action to be taken by all schools (version 13th Jan 2021) (including academies and independent schools)

Prevent the spread of infection by maintaining high standards of hygiene, including hand washing and regular cleaning and disinfection of surfaces. This will help prevent Covid-19 spreading in schools, as well as other infectious diseases. GUIDANCE: Visit gov.uk/coronavirus for detailed schools guidance, including cleaning and the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in schools.

SUSPECTED case in child or staff member

If the child/staff member is in school – isolate away from others and send home. (refer to PPE guidance if personal care is required within 2m)

Clean and disinfect rooms and equipment the suspected case was using – ensure appropriate PPE (gloves and an apron) are used.


Advise the child/staff member to get a test.

Ensure child/staff member isolates at home for 10 days (starting the day after the onset of symptoms) and only return once they have had no fever for 48 hours. The rest of the household need to isolate for 10 days.

You no longer need to inform the LA of a pupil/staff member who are getting a test

A positive LFD taken in a setting (school premises or testing hub) no longer needs to be followed up with a PCR

Positive LFD triggers a legal duty to self-isolate

A positive LFD not taken within a setting should be followed up with a PCR test

CONFIRMED case(s) in child or staff member

Ensure child/staff member isolates at home for a minimum of 10 days and only return once they have had no fever for 48 hours. The rest of the household needs to isolate for 10 days.

A positive LFT carried out in a setting does not require a follow up PCR test

CYP and Public Health colleagues will support the school to undertake assessments to determine if any contacts in the school need to isolate at home for 10 days. (The contact's wider household do NOT need to isolate).

If appropriate, letters will be provided to schools to send out:

- · to contacts, required to isolate for 10 days
- to all pupils and staff, advising on symptoms and how to get tested, if symptomatic.

Ensure that the rooms and equipment the confirmed case was using are cleaned and disinfected— ensure appropriate PPE (gloves and an apron) are used.

If further confirmed cases, complete Part 2
of Local Authority Form for each one*
If a negative PCR test is returned after a
positive LFT please complete part 2 with the
updated result (follow up OCR only
required if LFD taken home)

The affected pupils/staff will need to go home and isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms (the rest of the household need to isolate for 10 days.)

Cases and contacts can return to school once the isolation period is completed and they have had no fever for 48 hours
