How might we lean into the adaptive challenge of the Covid-19 pandemic?


How might we learn practices that move us into sustainable missional leadership and change both personally and corporately?

Statistics for Mission: Thank you to the 54% of churches throughout the diocese who have submitted their Statistics for Mission for 2020. The online system for submitting this data was due to close on Friday 31 January, but has been extended until **Friday 26 February 2021.** The online parish return system can be accessed here: https://parishreturns.churchofengland.org/. A request from the Safeguarding Team: A reminder to all Parishes that when you appoint a new Parish Safeguarding Officer, the person will need to have an up to date DBS check covering both children and adult workforce. They are also required to have completed Basic, Foundation and Leadership Safeguarding Training Modules. Smaller PCCs' charity exemption extended to 2031: PCCs with an annual income under £100k are currently exempt from the requirement to register with the Charity Commission and to submit annual reports to them. The exception was due to expire on 31 March 2021. The Government has extended the exception for a further 10 years, to 31 March 2031. Exempt churches can download a charity certificate as proof of charity status for online donations from their entry on www.achurchnearyou.com.

COVID-19 and your Ecclesiastical Church Insurance policy: In light of current uncertainty caused by the outbreak of COVID-19 Ecclesiastical understand that there will inevitably be an impact on your insurance needs.
