News from the Diocese

As we near the end of term, I do hope that you are able to celebrate the joy of Advent and Christmas as a church school. It was a joy to meet together in person for our annual church school leaders' conference on 1 November. We met in the Edmund Room at the cathedral in Bury St Edmunds. We had a rich programme of speakers. Dr Margaret James, National Director of SIAMS from the Church of England explained the changes to the SIAMS inspection framework and Gemma Taylor looked at how context plus theology equals vision.
