News from the Diocese

Dear colleagues,

As we approach February half-term, I am very aware of how challenging this term has been, with high levels of Covid-related and other absence among staff and pupils. On behalf of the Diocesan Board of Education, which met last week, may I express our thanks and appreciation for all that you are doing in church schools across the diocese? I hope that next week offers some respite.

We await the publication of the DfE's White Paper and its implications for schools. In the meantime, I am pleased that SIAMS inspections have been paused for January and February in the light of Covid absence, whist Ofsted encourages schools to request a deferral if cases are high. Cases are beginning to fall, after a peak, and let us hope that they continue to do so.

It was good to welcome Colin Tapscott to our Headteacher forum last month. Please read on for Colin's four key elements to leaders' wellbeing (four Cs) and other resources from Everyday Leader. It was also good to meet with Chairs of governors at our recent Chairs' forum. Thank you to all our governors for their vital work in supporting church schools.

We plan to hold our annual cathedral service for church schools in the summer term this year, on a weekday afternoon in term time rather than on a Sunday afternoon in October. If you have any comments, please let <u>Jacqui</u> know- there is no perfect time!

I was delighted to be able to join my fellow Diocesan Directors of Education (DDEs) recently in person for the first time since the pandemic. Whilst we have been meeting regularly on Zoom, it is no substitute for catching up in person. We are about more than the roles we fulfil- we share a commitment and our professional network sustains us. There are 39 DDEs in England and each of us has a responsibility for education in our own diocese. We serve in different places and contexts but all share the same faith and the same vision for education. In the same way, our church schools in Suffolk each serve different local communities but share the same


purpose. I was encouraged by these words and hope you are, too:

4 key elements (4C's) to wellbeing for leaders (also applies to humans too!)

- 1) **CLEAR** on our Purpose & Values and operating in them.
- 2) **CONFIDENT** in what we are doing. Equipped and empowered to lead from our strengths and partner on our weaknesses.
- 3) **in CONTROL** we know what we can't control and focus on what we can control.
- 4) **CONCENTRATE** on where we need to bring balance. Life is constantly moving and sometimes things like sleep, diet, exercise, relationships, self-improvement get imbalance and we lose the energy we gain from them. Good wellbeing comes when we realise and invest time and energy back into the gap to replenish ourselves again.

School Forum rep vacancy

There is a diocesan vacancy on the Schools Forum. This is an important decision-making statutory body, made up of representative Headteachers and governors who together make decisions about school funding in Suffolk.

These include making changes to the schools funding formula, the balance of spend between delegated budgets and de-delegated / centrally retained expenditure and expenditure on a small number of defined categories, such as capital financing.

The Schools Forum also acts as the principal focus for consultation with schools on matters affecting schools budgets, the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG), and general financial issues affecting the local authority and children's services.
