Bishops' Summer School 2021: The Gospel of John

St Edmundsbury Cathedral Wednesday 21 - Friday 23 July daily 2.00pm - 5.00pm

What would you say to your closest friends, your nearest and dearest, the night before you died? What would you do? How would you be? Maybe more important for Christians is to know what Jesus would say, do and be when he knew he was about to die. Well, we have an account, given to us in the Gospel of John, chapters 13 to 17. It's also where

Jesus unpacks what it means to follow him and, along with the Sermon on the Mount, is Jesus' most prolonged and substantial piece of teaching in the gospels. But it takes some unpacking and understanding.

Please join Bishop Mike to unwrap the gift of John 13 to 17. There will be teaching, conversation and refreshments. Each of the sessions can stand alone so don't worry if you can't make all three. And they will also be recorded if you want to watch one or more of the sessions later. This is the first of what the Bishops anticipate will be an annual Summer school looking at some aspect of Scripture or theology.

MSM-Flexi



Mission Shaped Ministry is a one year learning journey, equipping people to begin, sustain and grow mission initiatives including Lightwave groups. This flexible version of the course is specifically designed for whole teams who want to work together to reach out to their community or network and help

others to discover God's love. You choose the modules you want and the order you do them in. You can even choose whether to meet in person or on an online platform. You can receive training and resources to facilitate the course yourselves, or you can have expert trainers from the Lightwave team, depending on availability. There will be a number of groups starting September each year, as MSM-Flexi is used as part of the Auxiliary Ordination Pathway, but you can start whenever you like. Eastern Region Clergy Pre-retirement Conference 2021

Tuesday 16 November 2021 10.00am – Thursday 18 November 2021 2.00pm Pleshey House of Retreat, Chelmsford CM3 1HA

For clergy within three years of retirement age. This is a chance to look at the more personal and spiritual issues around the question: What do I hope for in retirement? This event allows us to explore together the spiritual, practical and psychological steps into a new phase of life and ministry in an atmosphere of quiet reflection, with input from The Venerable David Lowman, a retired archdeacon from the Diocese of Chelmsford, and Anne Power, a psychotherapist and Church of England congregant. Opportunities for learning and reflection – open to all!

The following three courses currently planned to take place in person, 7.30pm - 9.30pm at Earl Stonham Village Hall, IP14 5HJ, though some may run at least partially on Zoom.

Being Anglican: six Wednesday evening sessions looking at what makes us distinctive as Anglicans, with bits of church history thrown in! This course is useful for all who find themselves wondering why we do what we do, or how we come to be as we are in the Church of England. Wednesdays 8, 15, 22 and 29 September, 6 and 13 (or 20, tbc) October 2021.

Enhancing Pastoral Ministry: seven Tuesday evenings exploring the theology and practicalities of pastoral ministry and looking more closely at particular areas (such as death and dying, disability, and caring for carers). This course is particularly useful for new Lay Elders with a pastoral role (as well as for continuing development for any involved in pastoral ministry). Tuesdays 14 and 28 September, 5 and 12 October, 2, 9 and 23 November 2021.

Enhancing Worship: six Wednesday evening sessions which aim to better understand worship, explore different ways of worshipping, and develop the practical skills needed for designing and leading worship. This course is particularly useful for new Lay Elders with a liturgical role (as well as for continuing development for any involved in leading worship). Wednesdays 3, 10, 17 and 24 November, 1 and 8 December 2021.
