Tracey Caffull

Tracey is the CEO of the Diocesan MAT. She describes her career as having had the privilege to 'make the difference'. Spanning 23 years in Education, Tracey has worked in many roles including class teacher, deputy head, Headteacher, executive Headteacher and Director of Education before embracing her current role. She has worked across Essex and Suffolk and worked in areas of promise such as Jaywick and Clacton. As a champion of 'education building the foundations of children's futures' she is an advocate for an 'anyone can' attitude.

The Venerable Sam(antha) Brazier-Gibbs Archdeacon of Ipswich

After a brief career as a sports therapist, I was ordained in 2006 and began my ministry with a curacy in the Grays Thurrock Team Ministry. I then served in two pioneer roles in the Diocese of Chelmsford, before becoming the incumbent of three rural parishes and team leader for a group of 17 churches in West Essex, overseeing a team of 12 ministers. Alongside parish ministry, I also worked part-time as a PE teacher in the private sector and as a tennis coach, before joining the team in St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

Over the years, I've held several diocesan and wider church roles, including Liturgical Adviser to the Bishop of Barking, Assistant Area Dean, member of Diocesan Synod, and non-residentiary canon of Chelmsford Cathedral. I also serve as a Chaplain to the Sea Cadets – a role that occasionally allows me to indulge my love of visiting Royal Navy ships!

My passions include wellbeing, mission and evangelism, pilgrimage, and living by a rule of life. Outside of ministry, I'm a proud parent to an almost 19-year-old son. I enjoy county-level tennis, hiking, wild swimming, boating, weight training, gardening and musical theatre.
