Why am I standing for General Synod?

I am passionate about the Church of England and the privilege we have of serving the nation as we point to Jesus. It has been a blessed experience to have been assistant and then Rural Dean, working with clergy and laity across the deanery.

What can I offer General Synod?

As we seek to become a simpler, humbler, bolder church, I believe I have the following skills, experience, and background to contribute to General Synod.

- A younger voice. As a 34 year old, I hope to provide an important voice and perspective to Synod which will allow us to move forward confidently as we seek to reach the nation for Christ.
- A diverse voice, shaped by my international upbringing as well as being of UKME (Chinese) background. As General Synod considers issues around diversity, racism, and equality, I hope to offer a helpful perspective in order that we might best reflect the diversity found in the Living God, and serve each individual in our parishes well.
- A rural voice. Although most of my life has been spent in urban settings and ministry, coming to Wickham Market has helped me learn to appreciate the unique joys and challenges that come from being in a rural community. It is important that decisions made on a national level serve the needs of our rural communities.
- A financial background, centred around my first degree in Actuarial Science, means I will be able to engage well with discussions on finance as we seek to be faithful, ethical stewards of the resources we have, using them to serve God's kingdom while maintaining a concern for the wider creation.
- Experience working with other organisations. The Church of England does not exist in a vacuum and it is important that we engage with other denominations and the wider society around us. I have experience working within an ecumenical partnership as well as the privilege of serving as a governor at a Church of England Primary School.
- A concern for those without a voice. In the local community, I have helped our church
 to establish a project to tackle food poverty. On an international level, I have an interest
 in helping those who are marginalized and in need, engaging with issues like the
 persecuted church, and other global challenges, e.g. those from Hong Kong seeking
 political asylum.
- Holding the old and the new together. I have a love of our Anglican liturgy and traditions,
 while also being able to share in contemporary worship. During the pandemic, our
 Benefice have been able to make use of new technologies without losing a hold on the
 rich heritage of our worship.
