Ideas for Spiritual Development...


How about using a **beach ball** to explore some deeper questions - these could be related to the school's Christian Vision e.g. what do you think is the most important value we learn about here at school and why?

Current news can be difficult to navigate with children. Using a resource such as Picture News or Newsround ensures that it will be delivered at an age-appropriate level. Why not use the Wows, Ows and Nows structure to help process the information – what makes you say 'WOW' - moments of awe and wonder, which make you feel 'OW' - stirs up uncomfortable feelings or even worries, and which make you want to act 'NOW'?

Many schools will say **grace** before eating. Why not mix this up by having a 'thankfulness moment' before eating – allowing the children and adults in the room to choose from a range of thankfulness statements, Christian graces and invitations for spontaneous expressions of thankfulness.
