# Several churches are getting busy inviting people to Christmas.



Join Stanton church and 'Follow The Star' on Friday 2
December which includes the Village Christmas Tree
lights and outdoor Nativity Lights switch on. This is
followed by a free evening of family crafts ... why not
make a sheep, candy-cane shepherds' crook, crown,
jewelled stained glass window star, an angel or star
decorations, or add a star to a garland of stars across
the altar rail. This event is open to everyone. The
church will be giving away the book 'Amazing Days' from
the Bible Society to families and the local schools and

this has been funded by the Diocesan Growth Fund.

Also funded by the Growth Fund, Cockfield Benefice is holding a Messy Church Christingle and are also giving age-appropriate books telling the story of the real meaning of Christmas, along with a Christmas card, to all the children at both of the local primary schools and pre-school.



St Edmundsbury Cathedral will launch a season of angelthemed activities.

You can collect an Angel Trail leaflet when visiting and see if you can spot all the angels and cherubs in the Cathedral. This year a pair of angel wings have been painted by a member of the Cathedral community so you can have your photo taken "wearing" the wings! Visitors can also pop into the Treasury for a mini-exhibition from the Ancient Library of angels in print. Before they leave, guests can also grab an angel cookie from Pilgrims'

Kitchen and check out all the angels in the Cathedral Shop.

On 19 and 20 December the Cathedral will be hosting family activity days. There will be a best dressed angel fancy dress competition and children can make a wish and pop it on the rainbow tree!

Dean Joe Hawes said, "Angels have taken flight in popular imagination to the extent that many who have trouble believing in God or Jesus have no problem believing in angels. We encourage everyone to visit us during Advent and while having a look at our angels, perhaps think about the angels in their own life. Or perhaps consider that you might be an angel to someone else!"

Other churches in Bury St Edmunds and the surrounding villages are also taking part in Inspiring Angels.

St John's Church in St John's Street, Bury St Edmunds, has a wealth of angels in carvings and stained glass. St Mary's Church on Honey Hill has the largest number of carved and stained-glass angels in the diocese. You can also visit their 2.5m tall Angel Gabriel!

Holy Innocents' Church in Great Barton is running a competition to name their "Lonely Angel", the one angel in the rafters that still has a head - the others were sawn off during the Reformation!

Finally, Horringer Church is holding an Angel Festival, involving church members, Ickworth Park Primary School, Pre-School, 1st Horringer Cubs and Scouts, the WI and Horringer Gardening Club, where everyone is making angels! The exhibition will feature a 3m sculpture of the Angel Gabriel suspended from the Chancel Arch!

## **Exploring the New Testament**

Wednesdays 11, 18 and 25 January and 1 and 8 February and 1 and 15 March 2023 at 7.30 - 9.30pm

Earl Stonham Village Hall, Forward Green IP14 5HJ

Led by the Revd Canon John Parr, Exploring the New Testament takes a story-shaped approach to the heart of Christian faith. This seven-session course is for those on the AOP pathway, licensed ministers such as Lay Elders and LLMs, and anyone else who wants a fresh perspective on the New Testament. The course is an invitation to picture the impact of Jesus as a series of layers. Each layer tells its own story, with the story of Jesus at the centre. Each layered story belongs to a bigger story that continues into the present and can only be approached through the other layers – which makes interpreting the New Testament an unending, challenging experience.

The course is free of charge for those on the AOP pathway and studying for Permission to Preach. The course is open to all and costs £25, but those who are in commissioned or licensed ministry and so eligible for a <u>CMD grant</u> can make an application via <u>lesley.steed@cofesuffolk.org</u>.
