National Day of Reflection 2021

Since the first UK Covid-19 lockdown began in 2020, millions have been bereaved. The National Day of Reflection, coordinated by the charity Marie Curie and officially supported by the Church of England, will designate a special day to reflect on collective loss and grief.



On 23 March 2021 there will be a minute's silence at 12 noon to create a moment that shows support for the millions of people who've been bereaved. There are many ways your church can get involved:

- Publicise the day through your usual channels social media, newsletters, service notices and share the social media graphics provided.
- Light a special candle in the church and say the prayer film it with your camera and share on social media.
- If you can, make arrangements for a church bell to be tolled for one minute at noon on the day.
- Email or print off and send a prayer postcard to anyone and everyone to use at home on that day.
- Involve the local school and encourage them to use the simple prayer at noon or to colour daffodil cards and deliver them to a local care home.
- Invite people to plant a seed, a bulb, a bush as a sign of hope.
- Invite people to tie yellow ribbons to a prayer tree or railings as a sign of their prayer and support for all who are bereaved.
- Open your church for private prayer on that day, if you are able.

"There is so much planned for Easter: Three projects ,which received money from the Growing in God Growth fund, have been able to provide books, Easter garden materials, craft and prayer activities to primary school pupils in Botesdale, to an ever-growing number of families in Cockfield and Felixstowe and the primary school and community groups in Horringer.

Easter in a bag, a Lego build and exciting opportunities for using an outdoor space for play after school is being set up at the Lindburgh Road Church plant. A remembering tree of prayer is available in Woodbridge and a new outdoor church in Bacton. Meanwhile Grundisburgh are offering a hearts trail and Easter messy fun. The pram pitstop (a donation/gifting scheme of children's clothes, equipment and toys) in Christ Church Felixstowe is overwhelmingly supported and is continuing to make new connections with young families. Finally, Mission Ipswich East are offering an Easter 'Bake off', Easter books and Messy Easter ".

Hilary offers support to parishes seeking opportunities to develop and grow ministry with families and has a series of resources and information to support you. Lightwave small group leader training 14, 21, 28 April, 7.30pm to 9.00pm
