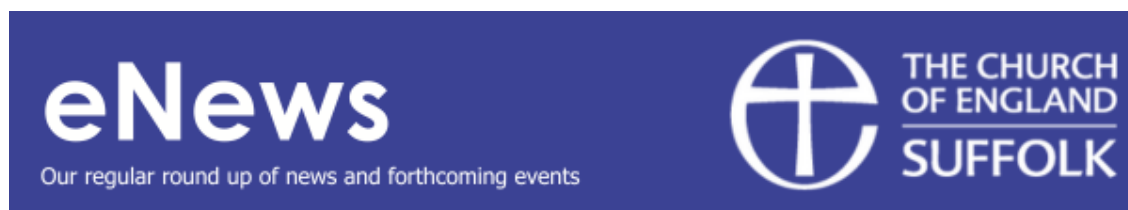

Suffolk's incoming Bishop was deeply moved by the moment she was legally confirmed as the county's next diocesan Bishop during an historic service in London.

The Confirmation of Election service was a mixture of legal court and personal commitment, surrounded by prayer and worship at Saint Mary-le-Bow church in Cheapside, London.

The service was held in front of well-wishers from both Suffolk and her previous ministry as Bishop of Stepney, where she has served since 2019.



The Rt Rev Dr Joanne Grenfell said afterwards: *"I found the service to be deeply moving. I have a huge sense of being surrounded by prayer, encouraged, and supported by the people of Suffolk. That's been there throughout. Now amid my preparations for my move to Suffolk to be Bishop, I am so grateful for this support from those who were able to attend in London and all those whom I will soon meet in my new role."* [Read full story on our website here.](#)

Friday Club, St Andrew's Church, Melton used their £500 growth fund to help build

their Friday Club, a club aimed at providing an inter-generational time of fellowship with a gentle introduction to church. The Club meets on alternate Fridays through term time at the end of the school day offering valued discussions for parents and carers and a healthy meal for the children. At each session, there is a theme, which might be love or forgiveness for example, which is then reflected in activities as well as a short 'circle time' discussion. After its inception, the Club very quickly filled up to maximum capacity, and there is now a waiting list for children wishing to join the Club.

The grant from the Growing in God fund has enabled the purchase of toys and games suitable for the range of 3 to 10 year olds, art and craft materials, and outdoor games to use in the church grounds on sunny days. Kagera Update



Last month, the Diocese of Kagera (Tanzania) celebrated its 40th Anniversary with a Diocesan Convention led by Bishop Darlington and senior clergy, with parish pastors (clergy), evangelists and congregation members attending. Our Diocese was represented by Canon Matthew Vernon (the Cathedral) and Adam Geleiskey (St Margaret's, Ipswich), both members of our Kagera Working Group. At Kagera Cathedral, there were five days of

worship and prayer, parish choir songs and dances, and teaching sermons. The parish choirs performed the two songs they had been invited to write for the anniversary. For us, 40 years may seem a young diocese. In those years the Diocese of Kagera has achieved remarkable development and growth - in (to use our measures) numbers, influence, depth and younger. Baptisms with hundreds of candidates. Transformative social programmes in agriculture and education. Theological teaching and preaching. Sunday Schools with hundreds of children. They thank God for all this and we thank God to be part of their story.

The Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 10 August lasted for over six hours. Presided by Bishop Darlington, the preacher was the Archbishop of Tanzania, Maimbo Mndolwa. Former Bishop of Kagera, Bishop Aaron, was there, as was Archbishop Donald, the former Archbishop of Tanzania. There were representatives from other Tanzanian dioceses, and bishops from the neighbouring Burundi and Rwanda.

Part of their growth has been the division of one diocese into three: Kagera Diocese, Lweru Diocese and Biharamulo Diocese. The three bishops (Darlington, Godfrey and Vitalis) hope to attend the enthronement of Bishop Joanne. And they are looking forward to welcoming her to their dioceses when she visits for the first time.
