As part of this month's theme on Growing Younger, Lauren Bridgwater, the youngest member of the Diocesan team, is pleased to share her story. Lauren, now aged 23, joined the Diocese Communications Team in September 2019 as an apprentice. Now a fully fledged member of the team, in the role of

Communications Assistant, Lauren says learning on the job has really kickstarted her career and boosted her confidence, leaving her feeling she knows her new job inside out before even starting. "On my apprenticeship I was learning new things every day about all aspects of the diocese – it really gets you up to speed," she said. "It was not just the digital advertising side but learning about the Church of England as a whole, the role it plays in the community and meeting fascinating people. The job experience has been invaluable."

Lauren said the church has a lot to offer young people and the wider community. She said, "You get the spiritual and religious side of things, but then also the incredible community projects – the youth clubs, environmental campaigns and the work the church does with schools. The part of my job I love the most is speaking to people who have found comfort in the church and have been inspired to help other people too. It's lovely to hear those stories."

This Sunday 16 January, Ipswich's town and civic church, St Mary le Tower, has been chosen to host Sunday Worship, BBC Radio 4's famous live Sunday morning church service. This Sunday, a service of Choral Matins will come live from Ipswich, led by the Vicar, the Revd Tom Mumford, along with the church's choir, directed by Christopher Borrett.

Expressing his excitement Tom said: "To be asked to host Sunday Worship is an enormous privilege. It was quite unexpected, but it is a testament to the mission and ministry we are pursuing here, not least through our choral tradition which, quite rare for a town, includes both adults and children. My hope and prayer is that people, wherever they tune in from, will experience the peace and presence of God, and hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ, which is the story of God's love, afresh for them."

Message from Gary Peverley, Finance Director, on Parish Share end of year payments:

Thank you to all of our parishes for your giving towards parish share so far for this year. We would like to remind you that we continue to accept payments towards the 2021 parish share **up to and including Monday 31 January 2022. Payments received after that date, unless we know about them in advance, will be treated as 2022 parish share.** This is to enable us to move more quickly to close our own accounts and prepare for our statutory audit. We understand that, for some parishes, it can take time to work through final parish share payments for the year just ending, but would appreciate it if we could all work to the timetable above and understand the cut-off dates. Our preference is to receive funds via online banking (but please ensure you make clear which year the payment is for in the text field).

Any cheques must be received at the office by 31 January 2022 to be included in your 2021 Parish Share figures. Cheques received after this date will only be accounted for in your 2021 figures if you have told us by 31 January to expect the cheque so that we can accrue for it, allowing us to finalise our own accounts.

Culture Recovery Fund for Heritage – Emergency Resource Support

On 5 July 2020, the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport announced a £1.57billion package to protect the UK's culture and heritage sectors from the economic impacts of Covid-19. The Heritage Fund, in partnership with Historic England, is distributing this funding. This scheme will now be open for Expressions of Interest until **12.00pm (noon) on 18 January 2022.** Those invited to apply will have until 12.00pm on 3 February to submit a full application. This funding will support your organisation to build up or sustain your operations and begin a programme of heritage activity to help it re-establish itself, with a view to ensuring that by the end of March 2022, your
