# Church volunteers launch club to improve rural life for young people



A new club has been launched to address the issues of rural isolation for young people in Suffolk. The Rural Youth Cafe @ Hoxne Pavilion, near Diss, was formed by the Hoxne Benefice. The churches here wanted to expand their activities within the community: they already run 'Little Lambs', a carers and toddler group; a monthly Messy Church (which is coming up to its tenth anniversary) and events in the school holidays for 7-12

year olds, known as 'Club Create'. However, the Benefice realised there was a gap in provision for young people aged 12-16.

Now the rural youth club, which started in January, is meeting monthly for two hours on a Friday evening where food, table football, pool, board games and creative activities are organised. Initial planning and purchase of equipment was funded by a grant of £3,000 from the Suffolk Community Foundation Centenary Fund, and now further grants are being sought.

The Revd Canon Eleanor Goodison, Priest in Charge of the Benefice, said: "We believe the café offers a safe space for young people to come together and relax, in a very rural area of Suffolk where there are relatively few opportunities for teenagers."

# Cathedral kneeler embroidered in 1964 returned to creator 60 years later

Josie Sinclair was just 12 years old when she took part in the Cathedral's kneeler project in 1964 and had the honour of being the youngest embroiderer to provide one of the hundreds of kneelers gifted to St Edmundsbury Cathedral. Now, 60 years later, she has taken her kneeler home to her church in Haughley.

Almost 1000 kneelers were created in the 1960s to celebrate the Cathedral's extension. Across the county, those with a talent for embroidery were recruited by their church to make a kneeler. The Cathedral kneelers are located in the North Transept gallery, Chapels of St Edmund and Transfiguration and the Chancel as a visible sign of the connection between the parishes of the Diocese and the Cathedral. **Free Energy Audit and Support:** If your church hall runs community services then it may be eligible for free energy audits and fully-funded grants of up to £150,000 for energy efficiency works. These are available through the VCSE Energy Efficiency Scheme. The

closing date for applications for energy audits is 20 June. Applications for capital grants are being accepted until 14 August, and you can apply for these once you have had an energy audit through the scheme. ### The Clewer Initiative - Safe Car Wash

This year marks the 6th anniversary of the Safe Car Wash app, part of the Clewer Initiative anti-slavery project, which since its launch in 2019 has been downloaded 32,000 times with 7,800 reports submitted. The app gives users a checklist of questions to answer when visiting a hand car wash, and depending on the answers, they may then be urged to make a report to the Modern Slavery helpline. The data the app collects is anonymised and shared with the National Crime Agency and the Gangmasters and Labour Abuse Authority, two law enforcement agencies who are leading on efforts to stamp out modern slavery across the UK.
