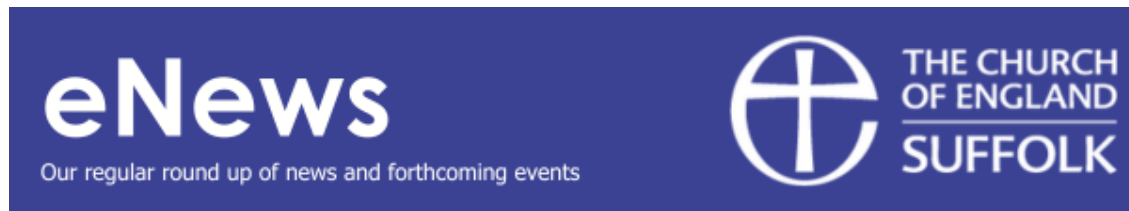

Suffolk sees 'encouraging' rise in church attendance

Our churches have seen a rise in congregation numbers – surpassing the overall national increase in church attendance this year.

Overall the attendance figures for 2023/2024 for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich reveal that adult average weekly attendance rose by 6% on last year, well above the national rise of 1.8%. Average church attendance for children also saw a surge, with a rise of 10% in Suffolk compared to the national increase of 0.4%. These figures show the growth throughout the whole Diocese and include the impact from growth projects in our church communities.

Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary, said: *"We are pleased to see church attendance is growing across Suffolk, particularly as we look forward to welcoming people into our churches over Christmas. The latest reported attendance figures highlight an encouraging trend in worship participation, particularly among children, within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich compared to national averages. I am delighted by this news as it indicates that our commitment to our Growing in God vision is working."*

Church attempts nativity scene world record



A Suffolk church community is attempting to break the world record for the largest number of nativity scenes in one place. St Mary's Church in Mildenhall now has more than 1,100 mini nativity scenes at the church, and aims to surpass the Guinness World Record figure of 2,150 by their final count on Christmas Eve.

Each nativity scene has been handmade or loaned by people living in the community, including children at the

local primary schools, scout and brownie groups and members of other local churches.

The Revd Sue Leathley, Team Vicar at the Forest Heath Team Ministry, said: *"We do something every year for the community so they can come in and get involved – lots of*

different groups and schools in the area. But this year we wanted to do something a bit different. We had a count at the weekend and we had reached 1,180 already, and we have the promise of several hundreds more this week. We are hoping we'll hit our target, and break the record, by Christmas Eve."

Suffolk church of 'national significance' gets grant to fix failing roof



The roof at the medieval church of St Peter & St Paul in Lavenham, is failing and stonework and windows are also in need of urgent repair. Thankfully, help is at hand. The church has been awarded a £20,000 grant from the National Churches Trust. On the recommendation of the National Churches Trust, the church will also receive a

£10,000 Wolfson Fabric Repair Grant from the Wolfson Foundation.

This is great news for the much loved church and ensures it can remain open and in use and able to serve the local community for many years to come. Repairs to intricately carved stonework, beautiful stained glass windows, flintwork and the roof will protect the building from rain and frosts, making the church a safe and welcoming place for the hundreds of people who use it every year. The Revd Canon Simon Pitcher said: *"We are very grateful to the National Churches Trust and the Wolfson Foundation for their help. 2025 marked the 500th anniversary of the building of the church tower. To celebrate we held an art exhibition including works by local school children, a black-tie dinner with the Revd Richard Coles, a family fun day with teddy bears zip-wiring from the top of the tower, plus a number of other special services and events. These activities involved the whole community, young and old alike, and drew in visitors from across East Anglia. If we were not able to keep our building warm, safe and dry these community and cultural events would come to an end. With grant support we look forward to having a warm, dry, welcoming building, open every day of the year, offering a safe and peaceful place for everyone to enjoy."*
