## Popular chaplaincy centre is a 'positive expression of Community'



The Revd Linda Pepper, Chaplain at the University of Suffolk, says she sees her role as helping students to 'navigate the waves of life'. Since starting at the university six years ago, Linda has helped develop a thriving community of international students at the university's chaplaincy centre, describing it as a 'cultural exchange'. Open to anyone of any faith

or none, Linda says the space is a great place to meet new people from across the globe, discover different cultures and make connections.

Three years ago the chaplaincy started an International Café event for the 35 international students at the university at that time. This year there are 300 international students so it has become an 'Open House' event between lectures now. Students come to meet each other and to chat with the Chaplaincy Team.

Among those who regularly attends events at the chaplaincy centre is International Business Management student Muhammad Bilal, 25, from Pakistan. "I love the culture here at the university, it's so diverse," he said. "I come here because we can meet different groups of people from different countries and areas. We also love Linda – she is great."

Linda said being a university chaplain is a vitally important, but somewhat unusual role. She said: "So much in university life is programmed and timetabled – there are not very many people whose job it is to hang around with people and offer them the gift of time. It's about being there for them, creating open and comfortable spaces for people to meet and share ideas and allowing people to open up about any worries they may have".

# **Audio Tour a huge success**



St Margaret's Church in Westhorpe recently launched an audio tour as part of their project to restore the church bells, which was funded significantly by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. The grant bid included the requirement to open the church and its history to a wider audience, and the audio tour did just the job!

The audio tour spans the centuries through six personalities who were influential to the village

including for example Mary Tudor, Queen of France and sister to Henry VIII who lived in the village during the 16th century with her husband, the Duke of Suffolk, and Lady Elizabeth Elmham who left money for the completion of the tower and for the bells.

West Suffolk College was approached and they were happy for six of their media students to be involved with the recording of our characters. Each character has an interpretation board outlining a short written piece, images and the QR code for the audio link. The church are grateful to G Signs and Designs Limited for providing the signs. There is also a bag of hats and accessories for each character for children to dress up in.

The project is an amazing example of what can be achieved if the local community are inspired and engaged. The church is grateful to all the volunteers who have supported the project and hope that the audio tour makes the church relevant to today and will inspire others to enjoy and value the beautiful space.
