Churches looking to reduce their carbon emissions can now apply for a 'Quick Wins' grant to help launch a small project. Grants of up to £5,000 can be applied for to help fund small-scale decarbonisation projects such as new LED lighting, pew heaters, insulation or updating electricity supplies. If the first meeting goes well, this will become a monthly meeting. Please feel free to invite other Estates Church leaders (lay and ordained) from across the Diocese to come along.


Digital Surgery with the Diocesan Parish Resources Team

"People often think funding forward is about 'saving the church' or just bringing in more money for money's sake to line the church's pockets. In fact this process is a lot more about mission than it is about money." Grace

Pomroy, author of 'Funding Forward' has spent years researching ways in which Christian mission can be funded in the 21st Century, especially using community enterprise as part of the mix, based on the sense of call of small missional groups and congregations.


Eco Church Bronze Workshop
