Fuel poverty will affect up to 100,000 Suffolk households by the end of the year

In these turbulent and uncertain times, Bishop Martin has underlined the responsibility to care for the poor and most vulnerable, and for the environment.

Bishop Martin is highlighting a huge rise in families struggling to earn enough money to pay for their heating bills. And he warns that a large number of Suffolk households will not benefit from the cap on gas prices because they are not able to access gas. He has urged

the Government to ensure that those households without a mains gas supply are not overlooked.

Bishop Martin has raised the issue close to his heart speaking in the House of Lords during the debate on the economy earlier this month too. The Bishop's call for urgent action was noted by Lord Callanan, the Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State, Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy.

Lord Callanan said Bishop Martin had raised the important subject of fuel poverty and added: "The Government are also aware that the energy price guarantee will leave those households currently with unregulated energy sources, such as those living off the gas grid, with uncapped bills this winter. However, our objective is that all households, regardless of their heating source, will be no worse off than an equivalent domestic gas household under the energy price guarantee."

Supporting others at the Rural Coffee Caravan



The Rural Coffee Caravan Team has really been focused on helping people in Suffolk stay warm and well this winter. Their Community Engagement Officers can provide specialist energy guidance about organisations and agencies who can be approached if you are struggling to stay warm in your home. This year the team are focussing on two issues:

Appeal for Slow Cookers: already they have raised enough to buy 700 slow cookers but so many more are needed. Slow cookers use very little power but allow

cheaper ingredients to be made into delicious nutritious meals - a great option for those experiencing fuel poverty. They are also fundraising to provide wearable blankets, hot water bottles and even electric blankets this year. You can donate to the appeal on their website and find out how all items are delivered straight from the Rural Coffee Caravans into homes where their value may be incalculable at the moment.

Warm rooms: The Rural Coffee Caravan, as part of the Team supporting this project, are asking those running community buildings, churches (where practical), pubs, cafes, libraries and more, to think about offering a Warm Space on a regular basis through the winter. If you are doing this, they are providing a map so people can find their nearest Warm Space. Please email them to be added to the map here: email. Offering a warm space is not just about warmth in the cost of living crisis but also about creating a community and combating loneliness during the winter months.



Edmund Lecture

Saturday 19 October, 4.00pm St Edmundsbury Cathedral, Bury St Edmunds IP33 1LS

Former Lord Chancellor and Ipswich-born politician David Gauke, has been announced as the speaker at the inaugural Edmund Lecture at St Edmundsbury Cathedral, part of the ongoing Abbey 1000 celebrations across the town.

The Abbey of St Edmund played a significant role in medieval political life which included parliament meeting at the Abbey on more than one occasion. This lecture honours that heritage and David's Edmund lecture will look on the importance of history, institutions, and the rule of law on the peace and prosperity of the nation.

David is the first Lord Chancellor born in Ipswich since Cardinal Thomas Woolsey was made Lord Chancellor in 1515. He entered Parliament in 2005 and was appointed Treasury Minister in 2010 and served there as Exchequer Secretary, Financial Secretary and Chief Secretary until he was appointed Secretary of State for Work & Pensions in 2017. In 2018 he was appointed Secretary of State for Justice and Lord Chancellor. Having opposed the Government's policy on Brexit, he lost the Conservative whip and decided instead to stand as an Independent in the 2019 General Election. He lost his seat and resigned from Government in 2019. David is now Head of Public Policy at Macfarlanes LLP, Senior Adviser

to Instinctif Partners and a regular columnist for the New Statesman and Conservative Home.

Heated Cushion Trial: We are running a trial over winter 22/23 to determine whether electrically heated cushions would enable churches to move to Net Zero by replacing gas or oil heating with green electricity and if they can massively reduce their energy needs by heating people not the building. The trial uses 30 "Nimma" seat and back cushions manufactured by "Sit & Heat". Each cushion turns on when someone sits on them, but the user can easily turn it off and on again. Tony Allwood is running the trial and will bring the
