## Diocesan Board of Patronage – re-run of the lay byelection

The Diocesan Board of Patronage (DBP) is the patron (either sole patron or jointly with another or others) of some 30 benefices in the diocese. Where a vacancy occurs in one of those benefices, the Board plays an important role in the vital process of selecting a new incumbent (or, where presentation has been suspended for any reason, a priest in charge). There is one casual vacancy on the Board. The DBP needs one lay member for it to be fully constituted. The person elected will serve until the end of the current six-year term on 31 December 2024. The lay position is open to anyone on a parish electoral roll. Candidates will need to be nominated and seconded by elected lay members of the Bishop's Council. Under the relevant Measure, they are also the electorate for any byelection.
