The event featured three inspiring keynote speakers, each offering a unique perspective on giving, fundraising, and generosity: Grant Forrest, CEO of the Parish Giving Scheme, Canon Jonathan de Bernhardt

Wood, Director of Giving at the Church of England's National Giving Team and Judi Newman, CEO of St Elizabeth's Hospice. Attendees also took part in a series of wellattended workshops that provided practical advice and support on a range of topics including grant applications, digital giving, stewardship campaigns, Parish Giving Scheme, banking, and more. The day left many encouraged and equipped with new ideas and tools to foster a culture of generosity within their communities.

One attendee said the conference was "a good opportunity to meet colleagues across diocese. A good day - well spent and learnt lots."

Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary said "One of the most important and valued aspects of the Church of England in Suffolk is to get together and learn together. Saturday was a wonderful example and it was good to see a roomful of people joining together thinking about generosity".

Village church celebrates £150,000 project to restore its bells



Worshippers are celebrating a successful £150,000 campaign to restore the bells at their ancient Suffolk church which feature at everything from weddings and funerals to Remembrance Sunday. The restoration of church bells at Fornham St Martin, near Bury St Edmunds, was celebrated with a dedicated service on Sunday 28 May, attended by Bishop Graeme to commemorate the upgrade.

Bishop Graeme paid tribute to the parishioners, villagers, donors and bell ringers who had supported the fundraising initiative. Bishop Graeme said: "This was an ambitious but very necessary project for Fornham St Martin and I was delighted to attend the rededication service, and view the results of everyone's hard work. Now the bells can ring out once more, welcoming everyone to a variety of church and community events with a joyous and uplifting sound".
