Church mice help all ages share church services



St Mary's Church in Bacton has created two booklets for all ages to engage in worship featuring Mattie and Hattie the church mice. The first Mattie and Hattie book is *Great Communion Adventure*, a service of Holy Communion, Order One, from Common Worship, suitable for all ages to engage in the liturgy of the church in a way that is accessible for them. It can be used as a Sunday service booklet for everyone or used with a group of children in churches or schools.

The second book is the *Great Baptism Adventure* and is available now. This is a fantastic collaboration by a local team led by the Revd Carl Melville and designed and illustrated by Amanda Manley. Carl said: "*It can feel like we have our own language in church, and we want to*

help everybody engage with the words by means of a glossary at the back of the book. In fact, many of the adults in our congregation have also benefited from reading the explanations."


