
## **Bishop Martin's Final Presidential Address**

October's Synod this year was the first Diocesan Synod of the new triennium and was held in the St Nicholas Centre on Saturday 26 October. Bishop Martin welcomed new members and also thanked re-elected members for their continuing willingness to serve.

The theme of this Synod was "Looking back, looking forward". Bishop Martin reflected on the past ten years and the future, particularly on four key themes - strengthening finance, sustaining buildings, supporting ministry and engaging young people; as well as two overarching themes – working together and building trust.

This was Bishop Martin's last Diocesan Synod before his retirement in February 2025.

At Synod, Bishop Martin launched a new film about our link diocese in Kagera connecting with young people from our Diocese.

# New visiting Canon Theologian welcomed by St Edmundsbury Cathedral

St Edmundsbury Cathedral is delighted to announce that The Reverend Dr Victoria Johnson, Dean of St John's College Cambridge, is to become visiting Canon Theologian and a nonexecutive member of the Cathedral Chapter.

Dr Johnson is a previous Canon Precentor of York Minster, overseeing the musical and worshipping life there. Prior to this she was a Residentiary Canon at Ely Cathedral, and a priest in

the Diocese of Manchester, having been ordained there in 2007.

Victoria is looking forward to her new role at St Edmundsbury Cathedral and said, "I'm really delighted to be contributing to the life of the Cathedral in this way. Learning about God and the world is a vital calling of the church and central to its ministry and mission. For me, theological learning and thinking about our faith together is something every Christian can engage with and is more relevant than ever to twenty-first century living."

Farewell to the Aldeburgh All-weather Lifeboat Freddie Cooper



Last Sunday Aldeburgh said goodbye to RNLI all-weather lifeboat, Freddie Cooper. This is the boat that Bishop Martin preached from earlier this year to mark the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the RNLI. The event honoured the lifeboat's legacy over the past three decades and the brave volunteer crew members who launched 271 times, helping 351 people, and saving 35 lives.

As part of the event the Revd Mary Brown led a short service of thanks. The service made space for rejoicing in all the blessings God has given through this boat, and the community was offered the support of God and the church in this time of change.

After the service, the crew launched the Freddie Cooper from the beach one final time. The two Aldeburgh inshore lifeboats were also launched, escorting the Freddie Cooper to Sizewell, where they handed over the escort to Southwold RNLI's inshore lifeboat which had come out to join them.

In many of our churches, where the weekly service may be some form of the Eucharist, the Old Testament nowadays is never read. And even where it is, it is often ignored. But it is the larger part of the Bible and has far more to say than the New Testament about things like the life cycle (birth, marriage, death), sickness and health, daily work, the environment, social justice, and so on. In other words, it relates to life as we know it on a day-by-day basis. Of course, there are some challenging bits which need also to be confronted in an honest manner, but they should not deflect us from the riches of what was, after all, Jesus's Bible. (Where did he get the first and great commandment ... and the second is like, namely this...?) In this short course, Hugh Williamson will try to open our eyes to some of this wealth by surveying in an engaging manner all the different types of material in the Old Testament, very much with an eye on how we can apply it in our own times in both church and society.
