Hospital chaplain says her role is like 'helping people through a storm so they don't feel afraid'



Linda Peall has worked as a healthcare chaplain within the NHS for the last 20 years, having spent the last six years at East Suffolk and North Essex NHS Foundation Trust (ESNEFT), one of the region's largest NHS trusts. Linda leads a multi-faith and belief team of chaplains and chaplaincy volunteers whose role is to provide pastoral, spiritual and religious care for patients, relatives, staff and volunteers across the trust's

hospital sites.

Linda said she sees her, and her team's, role as providing round-the-clock wellbeing support to people across ESNEFT's hospital sites, whatever their faith or beliefs. "We are here when people are hounded by life's circumstances and need a moment of shelter," she said. "Our role as healthcare chaplains is to help people pause for a moment, providing a safe space for them to steady themselves, to discover the inner resources they need to get through." With 12,000 staff across ESNEFT's hospitals and healthcare sites, the chaplaincy team also has a significant role in supporting staff.

Archdeacon Rich Henderson, said: "The chaplaincy at Ipswich Hospital is there to remind us that we are never alone. Whether it's sitting quietly with someone in pain, praying with a family in distress, or encouraging staff at the end of a hard shift, chaplains bring God's presence into the everyday life of the hospital. Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) Digital Transformation Project

There are now more than 93,000 regular givers and 5,000 churches and parishes registered with PGS, with all 40 mainland dioceses engaged in the Scheme. With such continued growth, it's critical that the PGS platform and processes can rigorously stand up to today's sophisticated cyber challenges. As such, thanks to generous diocesan support and significant funding from the Church Commissioners, the Digital Transformation Project is well underway. The funding has enabled the PGS to make a substantial investment in technology to ensure the long-term scalability and enhanced security of PGS, while improving functionality for all users of the scheme. At the heart of the project is an update to the technology infrastructure and processes that support PGS. The key updates include:

- Integration with GoCardless for Direct Debit processing, enabling future scalability and enhanced fraud protection
- Introduction of revised gift forms for new givers, aligned with GoCardless requirements
- A refreshed PGS website, maintaining a familiar look while improving functionality
- Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) to enhance platform security
- Dynamic reporting tools to be introduced, enabling greater depth of understanding of PGS data
- Enhanced giver and parish portals, offering new features such as tax-year reports and QR code access
- Introduction of Terms and Conditions, to clarify service expectations without adding new obligations

Key dates

- Givers need to make any changes to their giving before 10 September 2025 as the PGS will not be able to make any changes or set up any new direct debits for October whilst the website is down. Givers can cancel their giving directly with their bank. The PGS team will be available via phone and email during this time to help (see details below).
- PGS Statement Receivers are asked to download any reports before 11 September 2025 as these will not be available after this date. Once the new platform is live, you'll benefit from dynamic reporting, which will allow you to access giving data more easily, as well as the monthly statements too.

- From 3.00pm on 11 September to 1 October 2025 the PGS website will be taken offline for data migration and the switchover to the new platform.
- On 1 October 2025 the new website and platform go live.

If you are a Statement Receiver and have not received any communications from the PGS it's likely they don't hold your current email address. Please contact them on info@parishgiving.org.uk to advise of your email address including your parish and PGS code. 
