Bishop of Dunwich to become next Bishop of Exeter

Bishop Mike has been appointed by His Majesty the King to become the next Bishop of Exeter. Bishop Mike will succeed the Rt Rev Robert Atwell, who retired last September. Bishop Mike's last Sunday in Suffolk will be on 29 September, and he will be installed at Exeter

Cathedral during the autumn.

Bishop Mike said: 'I am delighted and excited to be the next Bishop of Exeter. It will be a wrench to leave Suffolk and I do so with deep gratitude and affection for the diocese and county. It has been a joy to serve in the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich these last eight years. I have been in a privileged position of seeing the difference the Church makes to so many across Suffolk, as well as seeing people come to faith, commit publicly to their faith and to grow in faith across such a wide variety of contexts, and church traditions. I am so grateful to colleagues and congregations for their witness, wisdom and companionship on the way, all of which have been formative as a bishop. I now feel ready to take the next step, going from a suffragan bishop to taking on the added responsibilities that come with the diocesan bishop's role."

Suffolk vicar leads 'poignant' D-Day anniversary services with surviving veterans

The Revd Mandy Reynolds, Team Vicar in the Wilford Peninsula Benefice, has led services to honour the fallen in Normandy for more than a decade and she said this year's memorial service will be all the more important, as it may be the last anniversary she gets to commemorate with those who were there.

Mandy, whose father was a D-Day veteran, says it has been an "honour and a privilege" to have been part of remembering the brave soldiers who fought for our freedom, and those who helped rebuild the country on their return. Mandy joined the military as an army chaplain in 2004 and has led services in France every June since 2011.
