We are delighted to announce £1.3m of new strategic transformation funding



The Church of England in Suffolk has secured \pounds 1.3m funding over five years from the Church of England Strategic Transformation Fund to support its existing vision to create flourishing

congregations making a difference.

The project aims to support visibly flourishing and growing Christian communities across the diocese, including Ipswich, Bury St Edmunds, Haverhill and Felixstowe, up to 12 market towns and rural areas of the diocese. The work in rural areas could form a blueprint for Christian mission in other rural areas of the country.

Bishop Mike said, "This funding is a huge boost to the Church of England in Suffolk as we continue to build our Christian presence in our communities. We have learned a lot during the pandemic as we focused on serving our communities, and we want to continue to grow in whatever ways we can".

The new funding will enable churches to develop their work with children, young people and their families – particularly in deprived areas. The funding will also enable the development of a learning hub offering training, learning, events and resources to those in churches across the county, recognising the value of the parish church and the contribution they make to their local communities.

Bishop Mike adds, "I am delighted that with this extra funding we will be able to expand our parish training programmes as well as develop a leadership programme to further support our church leaders."

Churches rise to challenge as cost-of-living crisis strikes

As the country faces a cost-of-living crisis, Ipswich churches are rising to the challenge to help those in need – both financially and emotionally. Churches across the town are helping to make life easier, running nine 'top-up' shops across Ipswich, while providing vital community spaces for those in need.



Among these is The Lighted Cross (TLC) Renew Wellbeing Café at St Augustine's Church, which has been running every Wednesday and is attended by around 20 people, offering free refreshments and snacks and a host of games, crafts and activities to keep visitors entertained. Sue Pettitt, who helps run the event, said: "We have our message out with local GPs, occupational health terms and are known by the local mental health trust. The

whole idea is to provide a welcoming environment and space where you can just be".

Triangle Church, in Dickens Road, is another church holding a Wednesday wellbeing event, where people can find a range of support and signposting to relevant service providers, according to their need. This follows the church's weekly 'top-up' shop.

The Growing Rural programme has been developed specifically to help multiparish churches to see and grasp the opportunities for mission in their context. Goodbox (contactless device): GoodBox was placed in administration by the Court on 28 June 2022. Parish Buying's legal advisors (Walker Morris) have been in contact with the

Administrators (Frost Group) who state that they plan to continue to operate GoodBox while they work with various parties to secure a positive outcome to a restructuring plan. Funds donated through GoodBox devices continue to be safe, and are held in segregated accounts and will continue to be paid out to churches and cathedrals by the Administrator. 
