

Youth café attracts dozens of young people to St Augustine's Church, Ipswich



The youth café takes place every Thursday at St Augustine's Church, offering a host of fun games, table sports and a popular tuck shop. Andy Carson joined the church as a youth worker three months ago and says the café is one of the highlights of the week.

"It's becoming very popular," he said. "In the last few weeks we have gone from around 20 young people to around 35 a week. We get a good mix, some who attend the church but many who don't. The café acts as a chill out zone for the young people, somewhere they can come along to have fun and meet new friends. We want this to be a space people know is somewhere they can turn up for the whole two hours, a space they can walk in and where people will know their name." We are delighted to reveal that the money raised in sponsorship and donations to Suffolk Historic Churches Trust, from their annual fundraising day was £212,020, beating last year's amount.

Energy Footprint Tool launches on 12 January 2026

The Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) is now open for churches to enter energy use from 2025. You can complete the EFT from 12 January until 30 June 2026. Every footprint we leave behind shapes God's creation. Recording your energy use is an unseen but essential act of caring for people and the planet. By measuring and reducing energy use, we take practical steps to combat the impact of climate change and live out our calling to love our neighbours. Completing the EFT is a simple but powerful way to support the Church of England's shared journey to net zero. Each year's data builds a clearer picture of our carbon footprint and helps us act more strategically together. To complete the EFT, you'll need:

- Gas, electricity and other fuel bills covering **January–December 2025**
- Readings or billing information for each supply
- Basic details about your building(s)

Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme

The Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme (LPWGS) closes on the 31st March this year (or earlier if the remaining £6m is claimed, whichever is sooner). If you can, claim now! The scheme allows listed places of worship of all faiths across the UK to reclaim the full amount of VAT they pay on repairs over £1,000. Last year, the government introduced a reduced pot for 2025/26 and a cap of £25,000 per eligible building each year.

As of the 6 January 2026, the stats are:

Budget: £23,000,000

Funding used to date: £13,885,403

Value of grant claims in progress: £2,910,343

Funding remaining: £6,204,253

A good way to keep this in the forefront of the government's mind is for churches to thank

their MP and invite them to see the works they have completed. The LPWG Scheme has attracted strong parliamentary interest and churches need the certainty of funding available from 1 April 2026. Strong take up of the funding available will help show that there is a need.


