"Last week I was fortunate enough to visit two 'Top Up' shops in Ipswich. For those who don't know, Top Up shops provide a large bag of food for a token £2 payment, shoppers then choose what they want from food, toiletries and household products and more.



At the Triangle Church the doors open an hour before the shop for tea, coffee, cakes and chat, offering a real community feeling - we even sang happy birthday to The Revd Lawrence Carey! There is prayer too, a lot of the shoppers have no background and knowledge of church, but they see what is happening, and slowly may want to be part of it. It can't be forced or rushed but when people see the love of God in action it can change their perceptions.

As the cost-of-living crisis bites, how we, as a church, respond to it matters. Whatever the new Prime Mister does, a lot of people will be facing, at best, a static income and rising costs. The crisis will affect our costs too, as fuel bills for churches and schools rise, and remember these are not covered by the price cap. Nonetheless, this is an opportunity to reach out to those who need us most, and Top Up shops are one of the many ways we are helping others.

So this week, as we look at God's generosity I wanted to reflect on how many of our parishes are generous as they reach out into communities and bring the light of Jesus to them, showing love and compassion at all times. Not only in terms of financial giving but also giving the time and energy to support and help others. So, I wanted particularly to extend my thanks to you all, for the amazing things you are doing throughout our diocese".

Are you exploring your Christian calling?

We offer a range of ministries that serve the ministry and mission of the whole church and work collaboratively at all levels. For some people their vocation can be found through authorised ministries. For others, a specific interest may lead to a pathway of a distinctive lay ministry or a supportive role. This course is accessible to those starting out as volunteers, but deep enough to stretch those who are already working alongside young people.
