30 churches receiving free contactless devices in pilot scheme with National Church





We were delighted to receive over 70 applications from churches wishing to take part in the Contactless Church pilot scheme. Applications have now closed and churches have been informed of the outcome of their application. Thirty churches have now been allocated either a Payaz Giving Station or a CollecTin More, some

with an activated SIM (if no Wi-fi is available), and some have also been allocated a mobile router. This is an exciting development for those churches involved who will be receiving training and picking up their devices later in the month.

We would also encourage you to consider online giving through Parish Buying with 'Sum Up' and 'Give A Little' (costs nothing and takes about an hour to set up). 'Give A Little' also allows you to generate free QR codes (for more information about QR codes, please visit the Church of England website here) which can be printed on posters, pew cards, and service sheets, scanning them with a mobile phone takes the giver straight to your online giving page. Climate Change and the COP26

In the lead up to the global United Nations summit about climate change (COP26) which takes place in Glasgow from 31 October to 12 November, there are a number of resources available to consider:

- Why Faith Matters at COP26 is a resource by Green Christian containing insights from leading Christian theologians and climate activists.
- <u>Subsidised Energy Audits</u> for parishes are now available through Parish Buying, the usual cost of an audit is £445 (+ VAT). Qualifying churches will receive a subsidy of £200. The Energy Audits are part-funded by Parish Buying's green electricity supplier, Total Energies. Full priced audits will still be available after the 100 subsidies have been allocated.
